So in other words, the purpose behind that is to merely allow the Department of Health to adopt rules and regs that in the future would be promulgated by the federal government as it relates to asbestos removal. Is that not right?

SENATOR WESELY: That's correct, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Okay, thank you. That's all I needed to get into the record. I appreciate it, support the Wesely amendment to the committee amendments and the bill as it goes. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Hall. Senator Wesely, there are no further lights on. Would you like to close on your amendment? We are now voting on the Wesely amendment to the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the Wesely amendment to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The Wesely amendment to the committee amendments is adopted. Would like to recognize a guest of Senator Janssen.
