SENATOR DIERKS: Well, it is always nice to know, Madam President, that we have another Godfather in the house.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Further discussion on the resolution, on the amendment? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, I will withdraw it.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, it is withdrawn. For discussion on the resolutions, Senator Wesely, your light is next.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Madam President and members. You know, we have four resolutions up, I believe, three of them deal with basketball teams and their success. But I did listen to Senator Lynch's comments and I think we ought to not take lightly what he is offering to the Legislature. You know it is wonderful to praise basketball teams' triumphs, and I think that is obviously something we are all proud of and care about a great deal, but when someone gives their life to try and save others, I think that is particularly special and it is the highest thing that anybody can do for anybody else. So I think, particularly, Senator Lynch's resolution needs to be recognized and acknowledged and I praise him for bringing it forward.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, and, Senator Lynch, often kind of in jest, I will quote from the Bible, but I am going to quote a verse which says it better than I could, and I mean this seriously. Better love hath no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Any further discussion on any of the resolutions? Seeing none, the question is the adoption of LR 65, 66, 67, and 70. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of LR 65, 66, 67, and LR 70.

SENATOR CROSBY: They are adopted. Next item is a confirmation
