Have you all voted? Senator Hartnett. There's been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. The question before you is, shall debate cease? We are accepting call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Brown voting yes. Senator Bromm voting yes. Senator Kristensen voting yes. Senator Fisher voting yes.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Debate ceases. The Chair recognizes Senator Pedersen to close.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: Madam President, members of the Legislature, first of all with me, as Senator Crosby said, and I agree with her, to me this is first of all a matter of life. And second of all, I think it's something we need to do for these young people, and I will use the example again that everyone of us, most everyone of us in here have experienced going through the last months of pregnancy and coming up with unplanned expenses and things to go through, things getting ready, and things getting tight, and I would guess most of us in here had a spouse and a job, things to go with that. We're talking about these young ladies who don't have that. Don't have a spouse, don't have a job and need some help, three months, the last trimester.
