

light. Senator Matzke, to close on 407.

SENATOR MATZKE: I would merely ask that the bill be advanced. Thank you.

SENATOR LANDIS: With that, we'll move to the question of the advancement of 407. Those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR LANDIS: The measure advances. We move to the next piece of work on consent calendar, LB 581, introduced by the Natural Resources Committee. Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, LB 581 was introduced by the Natural Resources Committee. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 18th of this year, referred to the Natural Resources Committee. They report the bill to General File with no committee amendments.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Landis, members of the Legislature, this bill is procedural and largely technical in nature. There are two types of litter fees under this particular section of statutes. One has to do and is applied to retailers. The other applies to manufacturers and wholesalers. In one instance, we apply that we indicated in previous legislation that the collection and penalty provisions of the Nebraska Revenue Act would apply but we neglected with respect to the other half of the litter fee to say that the collection and penalty provisions of the Nebraska Revenue Act would apply. And so all this bill does is to make uniform the two sections of the litter fee and apply the collection methods that are typical in the collection of any tax, for that matter. Thank you.

SENATOR LANDIS: There being no committee amendments, that's on the motion to advance to E & R Initial. There are no lights. Senator Beutler, would you like to close? No close. The question is the advancement of LB 581. Those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Senators who are close to their desk, please return if you can and cast a ballot. Mr. Clerk.
