I had looked at both of the fiscal notes on this and I would like to ask Senator McKenzie maybe to update us a little bit on why there was changes in the fiscal note from one, I think it was a change, just to kind of update us a little bit on what those changes were and why there was a change.

SENATOR HALL: Senator McKenzie.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Senator Avery, can you be specific about which change you're referring to?

SENATOR AVERY: Well, the total...the total cost on fiscal year '96-97, originally it was like 7 million and it was...in the latest fiscal it was dropped to 5.5 million. Is there...and was this...I guess the other thing is this all General Funds in terms of that, what was it, a one-quarter or three-quarter percent? Three-quarter? Is that what the final...

SENATOR HALL: Senator McKenzie.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Senator Avery, the General Fund amounts are listed in the bill and those have not changed. The amounts on the fiscal note are based on projections of the amount of corn
