

in cheek. On Micron I'm sure there are some changes I would have liked to have seen, but that wasn't the case. The amendment is one that if agreed to, the bill moves. But I think we need to take the time to do it at this point and move the bill and, Senator McKenzie, I'll just ask you, do you want any of my time at this point or are you not ready yet? Okay. I will then yield back the rest of my time and urge the adoption of the amendment.

**SPEAKER WITHEM:** Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. By the way, just so the body knows as far as the agenda is concerned, we had budgeted about 20 minutes for consideration of all the bills on Select File that would not have amendments. It appears at this point that there are about four of those bills. I might ask the Clerk to read those for people, so it appears as though we do not need that time for consideration of those bills without amendments. So we will be continuing on this matter for some additional time then. Mr. Clerk, which bills currently do not have amendments filed?

**CLERK:** Mr. President, the following Select File bills, LB 668, LB 178, LB 300, LB 508; 668, 178, 300, 508.

**SPEAKER WITHEM:** Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Probably at about ten till twelve we'll break and be dealing with those bills then. Senator Wehrbein, for discussion on the Bernard-Stevens amendment. I'm sorry, Senator Wehrbein, your light was on. You're recognized to speak.

**SENATOR WEHRBEIN:** Okay, I just...kind of reiterate what I said I said earlier. I hate...my feeling is what the amendment says is the right way, but I do not want to lose the bill for the sake of language. And as I said before, I think everyone is committed to this bill as it was originally introduced. I'm comfortable with that. If we're going to get hung up over the language about the intent, then I think we ought to work through this. I would like to take a little time and work this through. We're on the verge of going to whatever it is, General File, and I would like to have some time and I'm not clear how we're going to do this. I think we can talk some things over and find out something that we all agree on and I'm comfortable that there is agreement here in the body of something we can do. And with that I would just hesitate a second. I will yield some time to Senator Bernard-Stevens.
