SENATOR MCKENZIE: Mr. President and members, I would ask unanimous consent to bracket LB 377.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question is before the body, the request is the unanimous consent to bracket. Hearing no objections, it is so ordered. Mr. Clerk, LB 275.

CLERK: Mr. President, 275 is on Select File. First item are Enrollment and Review amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Pedersen, would you move the amendments, please.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: Which amendment is that, please?

CLERK: Senator, these are the Enrollment and Review amendments to...there are E & R amendments pending. Those need to be considered first.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Pedersen, the Chair of the E & R Committee is not available on the floor so we're simply asking you to make the motion.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: You picked the next youngest one, thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move the E & R amendments on LB 275.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Very well done. Is there any discussion on E & R amendments? Senator Wehrbein, your light is on. I assume it's to discuss something in the future? All those in favor of the adoption of the E & R amendments indicate by saying aye. Opposed. They are adopted. Good job, Senator Pedersen. Anything further on the bill?
