We will walk on our shaky legs to this conference, cross our fingers, our eyes and our heart and hope for the best. The fact is we are in a position to put in a resolution what we choose. If, as Senator Witek pointed out, Texas can include a provision saying they want a constitutional convention, why are we going to be so weak-kneed that we will not even make a statement of what it is we do not intend by signing this resolution and sending delegates? I think there has been a lot of smoke-blowing and dust-stirring, not only by Governor Nelson, but by all the others, organizations and individuals associated with this operation. They send out material which is misleading in terms of what that conference is to be about...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and how it is to operate. Nothing on the page that I read from you...for you, I'm talking about what I actually read, is found in the resolution. But we're given the impression that when you agree to this resolution this is what the conference is binding itself to. And something else we need to consider, and I'm going to ask Senator Kristensen a series of questions but I want them to be in a package, what does the term "supermajority of the legislatures" mean when we don't even know whether a legislature that does not send one of these resolutions is a member of the compact or the group? Does it mean a supermajority of 50 legislatures, 1 from each state, or does it mean a supermajority of the 26, if they get the bare 26 that they need?

SENATOR CROSBY: Time. Senator Chambers, your light is next. Did you want to...
