

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. But since we have this corporation existing out there, would legislatures be able to offer additional input through that corporation which would then disseminate it among the states who are members, or don't you know?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, I'm not sure I follow when you say would legislatures be able to put input in there. You mean inputs of...of philosophy of money, or...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If the Legislature would adopt a resolution taking issue with something that was contained in this proposal, whether we call it the action plan or the petition,...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...would there be someplace to send that to see if it would be disseminated to allow other states to react and maybe make some changes without calling together all these states again, or has nothing like that been discussed?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I can't tell you that I've ever heard specific discussion about that. My guess is that if the mechanism is still open, let's say that this action plan goes out and that the states would adopt it but for one thing, could they all come back and change that one thing and then resubmit it to the states? I think that's probably a flexible part of the vehicle.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I'm asking, would they have to come back and meet again, or would there be machinery whereby that proposed change could be...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Oh, I see.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...distributed...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I see what you're saying.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...among the members and let them act on it and send their reactions in, and if a sufficient number would agree that change would be made, or would they have to come back together...
