SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Chambers. There's been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: The house is under call. Would all unauthorized personnel leave the floor. The house is under call. The house is under call. Would senators please come to the Chamber and check in. We're looking for Senator Lindsay, Senator Lynch, Senator Wehrbein, Senator Hartnett and Senator Janssen. The house is under call. We're looking still for Senators Wehrbein, Janssen and Lindsay. All senators having checked in that are currently present and not excused, the question is, shall the Chambers amendment be agreed to? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record vote has been requested. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on page 1262 of the Legislative Journal.) 12 ayes, 19 nays on the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: The amendment is not agreed to. We are now back on the bill. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Kristensen, if I may, would you please...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Beutler, would you please, excuse me just a second, we did have a motion on the desk. And the call is raised at this point. Mr. Clerk, the motion.

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to indefinitely postpone LR 16.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, after this motion I will not offer any amendments to the resolution because they're not going to be adopted. But I do take this very seriously. I think there are glaring defects in this resolution. The Legislature is going to put itself on
