So why will the legislators vote for a resolution perhaps making this state a part of a corporation? Let me ask Senator Kristensen a question, because he may know the answer to this one. And, Senator Kristensen, if you don't, you understand that I'm not making you the person responsible for gaps that are in this part of the resolution. You understand that, don't you? Well, you don't understand it. (Laugh.) I may have given him too much credit. But here's the question I want to ask you, who will be a member of this corporation, The Conference of the States, Inc.?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: The states, by their delegation, will become members of that particular entity.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, so the states will be the members of this corporation.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Through their delegation they will be and they're going to...they will...now you're going to ask me where does it say that at.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I'm not.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, you should.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, Senator Beutler is probably going to ask you that because I have other fish to fry right now. Maybe I'll get around to it, but at this point I want to ask you some other things.
