

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How does the state become a member? In other words, we don't know whether the only ones who can vote are those who send this resolution, even though Senator Beutler pointed out correctly that this is called a resolution of participation. We don't know whether the only ones who can be members are those who send one of these resolutions, do we? We don't know that from what we have available to us.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, Senator, if that...our resolution of participation sends our group down to participate in the incorporation to do that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But we don't know who the members are. In other words, the question I'm asking,...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Do I know who from this body the members are?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, do we know whether the only states that will be members are those who send this resolution?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: My answer was to the best of my knowledge that they were.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are they the only ones?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: To the best of my knowledge, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then other states who do not send one of these resolutions prior to the convening of the conference will not be members of that corporation? Is that true?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: To begin with, I believe that to be true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then we don't really know...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: You add them later.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...ultimately who will be members, if there is some way others can become members.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator, you and I had that discussion a few hours ago that it's possible for a corporation to add and subtract membership.
