

which is in the fund will be put back to the General Fund and as the money is repaid from existing loans, that monies will go to the General Fund as well. And again, I mentioned that Director Moul has looked at the amendments. We've been in discussion even this morning briefly and they support the amendment as well.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I'll waive.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Engel.

SENATOR ENGEL: Madam Chairman, members of the body, I'd just like to make two quick comments on these amendments and Senator Landis' amendment he did mention the \$3 million. Actually it's \$3 million for the next two fiscal years to a total of \$6 million so I did want to clarify that. As far as Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment is concerned, I totally agree with that along with the Department of Economic Development because I do believe in sunseting any new legislation we pass where funds are involved so that if it works, it works, if it doesn't work, we can get rid of it. And if it works well, the next legislature can certainly extend it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Engel. Is there any further discussion of the Bernard-Stevens amendment? Seeing none, Senator Bernard-Stevens waives closing. The question before you is the adoption of the Bernard-Stevens amendment to the committee amendments to LB 425. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.
