

Mr. Clerk. The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, next bill, 420...I am sorry, 490, a bill originally introduced by Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR HALL: We will pass over LB 490 beings Senator Kristensen is excused. The next bill, LB 189, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 189, a bill originally introduced by Senator Withem, Hartnett, Federsen, and Preister. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 9. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. The bill was discussed on March 14 of this year, Mr. President. Committee amendments were adopted at that time. I do have other amendments pending.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Withem, would you like to bring us up to speed on LB 189 please.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Well, in all reality, I would like to be brought up to speed on LB 189, but the status of the bill at the moment is that it provides for...the bill as introduced provided for a separate juvenile judge for the Sarpy County, for Sarpy County. Committee amendments include a district court judge for Lancaster County and a district court judge for Sarpy County. That is the status of the bill. I believe Senator Beutler has an amendment pending which deals with the concept of gathering information and data relative to caseloads. I think it is a good amendment. I plan on supporting it. With that, I conclude my briefing on the bill.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Withem. Mr. Clerk, an amendment on the bill.

CLERK. Mr. President, Senator Beutler has AMC937. Senator, I have a note you want to withdraw this one and offer AM1170.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler, we are on your amendment and we need a clarification with regard to whether or not you...which amendment you want to offer. The first one the Clerk has a note that you would like to withdraw.

SENATOR BEUTLER: For the moment, Senator Hall, I will withdraw them both.
