

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. The resolution has already been adopted so we don't need any discussion on it nor a vote. Senator Avery, did you have a quick point of personal privilege?

CLERK: Madam President, I do have motions on the desk. Senator Withem, I had amendments printed from you, Senator, 997. You want to withdraw that one. Senator...

What this would do, what the amendment would do is to take care of some of the questions on juvenile and partially a problem on district judgeships that are the subject of several bills this year, trying to get that solved, and they're trying to work out some of those differences. What it would do is creat...what the amendment would do is it would create the juvenile judgeship in Douglas County, July 1 of '95, juvenile judgeship in Sarpy County, July 1 of '96, and the additional juvenile judgeship in Douglas County, July 1 of '97.
