

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Lindsay. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. Just briefly a comment, actually referring to what Senator Chambers was saying. And I think it's something that we as a body need to be thinking about, not real seriously now, but keep it in the back of our minds for when the session gets towards the end. And I very seriously would...am considering offering a motion on about June 2nd that...and, Senator Chambers, I think you'll be supportive of this, that we will recess until about June 9th for that specific reason on the vetoes, that it makes no sense for we, as a body, to make policy decisions, have vetoes come down after we're gone. And what I think we should do, quite honestly, what we should have done a long time ago is recess, come back for the last day or two, or one day, whatever it takes, so that we have that process, so that all the vetoes come down, we have a chance to decide whether or not that's a policy we really want to make or not. And I think that's something we need to consider, and your comments sparked that...that I thought now would be a time at least to throw that idea out. At least that's something I'll be pursuing at the proper time. It makes good sense for a legislative body to do that. And with that, I yield back the rest of my time.
