

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay. So ordered. Senator Lindsay, then we'll go on to the next amendment. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Lindsay would move to return the bill to Select File for AM1193. (Amendment appears on pages 1292-94 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President. This amendment takes out the controversial portion of that last amendment, it simply adds those juvenile judges that we referred to and the Lancaster County district judge that the Judicial Resources Commission has suggested that we need there. That's simply what it does, it just adds those judges. It takes out all the language referring to the Resources Commission whatsoever. I would urge the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: For discussion on the Lindsay amendment, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, Senator Bono...I mean Senator Bromm, remember when I stood to speak I said I wasn't complaining about or objecting to the fact that people were trying to amend this bill, acknowledged that I have tried to do a similar thing but pointed out that, in view of the fact that I'm convinced that a juvenile judge is needed in Douglas County, I would hope that those who would vote to add these amendments would vote to override, should the Governor veto the bill because of those amendments. And I had also pointed out that even if the bill should be vetoed and we not be given an opportunity to override it, I would simply bring a similar bill next session. So I don't want anybody to get the impression that I'm taking offense at efforts to amend this bill, nor will I take offense if amendments are added. I will not even take offense if the Governor vetoes it, but I would take offense if we did not consider an amendment of the kind or a motion that Senator Bernard-Stevens is suggesting, because many years ago and down through the years I've suggested a similar thing, that when we've done so much work on bills that we deem to be important it is irresponsible to leave them in the hands of the Governor and not give ourselves an opportunity as a Legislature to override any vetoes he may make of those bills. So I would support what Senator Bernard-Stevens is talking about
