

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members, students, I would welcome you. And I think I've complied with your edict, Mr. Speaker. The amendment, I think, has been discussed. What it...and the questions, I think, went to the issues of how it works. You've heard from a couple members of the Legislature who are landlords, not on a large scale, couldn't afford to be in the Legislature, but they are landlords and they understand that problem. What this does, it tries to clarify that, and I think it really is a win/win situation where landlord is protected, tenant is protected, the city that Senator Wesely was originally trying to take care of their problem, they're protected, so it works into existing...the existing framework that we have. It just simply allows that notice to be given in the petition for eviction, so I think it does...it will, hopefully, protect all parties adequately. And, with that, I would urge the return to Select File and the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you. The motion is to return the bill to Select File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The bill is now on Select File. Senator Lindsay, on your amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I would simply urge the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Any discussion? Any closing? The vote is on whether the Lindsay amendment should be adopted. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the Select File amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is adopted. Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. Speaker, I would move to advance LB 175 to E & R for engrossing.

SPEAKER WITHEM: All those in favor vote aye. Opposed. The bill is readvanced. Mr. Clerk, LB 179.
