SENATOR ROBINSON: But what if...but what if it does happen? You are telling me you're not...you don't know for sure what would happen then? Whether the state would be liable or not?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I mean, first of all, Senator, the gubernatorial race is four years off, and what we are trying to deal with now are the legislative races, and I don't know the answer to the legal question, (interruption)...

SENATOR ROBINSON: But aren't...

SENATOR BEUTLER: I am not sure (interruption).

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...the Governors are not in this bill?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Pardon me.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Aren't the Governors in this bill?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, they are. What I am saying is that that part...I mean, we are not even approaching the funding for that part of it yet. We are trying to deal with the two...with the next election cycle.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah, but we would have to...we would have to deal with it eventually.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right. Right.

SENATOR ROBINSON: And I guess that's the question I have, even if we have to deal in three or four years, are we going to be encumbered for a large amount of money if that would happen in a gubernatorial race?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, Senator, (interruption).

SENATOR ROBINSON: You are telling me you are not sure. Is that what you are telling me?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, Senator, I am not sure what question you are asking me. I mean, there are all sorts of different possibilities to work out.
