SPEAKER WITHEM: Time.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...(interruption) financing the campaigns is also in there I understand.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lynch. Senator Lynch has called the question. Do I see five hands? I think I probably did at one time or another. One more time, are there five hands? There are. The question then is, shall debate cease? All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. Chairman, I would ask for a call of the house.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. Chairman, I would also accept call-in votes.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. All members return to the Chamber. We are voting on the question of ceasing debate on the Bernard-Stevens amendment to the Beutler bill. Call-in votes have been authorized.

CLERK: Senator Hartnett voting yes.
