

CLERK: 10 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Members, please return to their seats. Record their presence. The house is under call. Senator Janssen, did you accept call-in votes, or how do you want us to proceed?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, Mr. Speaker, I will accept those.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Okay, members, we are under call. Return to the Chamber. We're voting on the adoption of the committee amendments. Call-in votes have been authorized.
