I think it does give us a red flag that we want to look at what this regulation does in terms of takings, and I think that that will be the case after the implementation of these amendments. So I guess I urge the body to go ahead and support the Lindsay amendment and then the Jones-Wickersham amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Chambers on the Lindsay amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I had a little conversation with Senator Wickersham and I have a better understanding of what Senator Lindsay's amendment is going to do. And maybe Senator Wickersham will have some additional comments, but I'm going to support Senator Lindsay's amendment. But what I do want to talk about, because my time will run out if I try to do it just on the amendment that happens to be before us, I don't...I...Senator Jones, let me ask you a question, if I may.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Jones.
