

SPEAKER WITHEM: Okay, I will support the Lindsay amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Withem. There are no further lights on the Lindsay amendment. Senator Lindsay, would you like to close?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, members. Senator Withem just in a short couple of seconds there indicated what the bill does. What it does is it gets us to the white copy, AM1246, removes the provision that the Attorney General be required to do that analysis so that the Attorney General, under current law, would do analysis that the process was followed, that it's constitutional, that statutory authority is there. In doing the analysis he's doing anyway now he would follow that. So then the issue then that would be remaining would be the question of, is it good policy to have this analysis that's referred to in the Wickersham-Jones amendment? So, with that, I'd urge the adoption of the amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: You've heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the Lindsay amendment to the Jones amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the Lindsay amendment to the Jones amendment. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Lindsay's amendment to the Jones-Wickersham amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, do you have items for the record?

CLERK: I do, Madam President. Explanation of vote by Senator Witek. Health Committee reports LB 387, indefinitely postponed; LB 704, indefinitely postponed.
