

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Question.

SENATOR LINDSAY: That won't be necessary. Yours is the last light on. Would you like to close on your amendment?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Just briefly. I think we have had adequate discussion. The amendment simply front loads it. It has the intent language, that was on page 1240 in the Journal, concerning production agriculture. It transfers in the first biennium, and it appropriates, so it would be within the appropriation process in the outlying biennium. Senator Stuhr, just a parting comment, I think what Senator McKenzie was trying to say, she is trying to give you some help politically, and the fertilizer tax, along with sales tax, and income tax, and Game and Parks, sometimes, though that is in the Cash Fund, but other dollars that come in are all in General Fund. So I intend to go back, at least to my rural areas and say, you know, the dollars that we took from the General Fund, everyone of those dollars came out of Omaha. Those were all urban dollars and they are supporting agriculture because it is all mixed in the General Fund. So if you want to go back and say it was all agriculture dollars, that is fine. I think I will talk about the urban dollars that went in to help agriculture that might help out. With that, I move advancement of the amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. The question is the adoption of the Bernard-Stevens amendment to the McKenzie amendment. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment to the McKenzie amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the amendment, Mr. Clerk.
