

the state because it is not an ethanol facility, if it is sold from a nonresident, and in those cases where, in fact, we would have someone on the northern edge of Kansas selling corn to anything other than an ethanol facility. If we can work on something to agree that we deal with the problem but we aren't excluding every sale from a nonresident outside of ethanol, I certainly could support that. At this time, however, I will not be supporting the amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Senator McKenzie. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of this body, I stand to support Schrock's amendment because in my district there is no corn moves north. Everything moves south out of my district that's not...unless it is fed up there, and when you get down along the border there, everything would move south. The only thing this would affect is just right during harvest and a little bitty percentage of that would just go across the border to the north to the elevators so they wouldn't have to haul it. But in big lots on the off season, I cannot see it moving north because the price is higher down there because their feedlots are growing and the hog facilities are growing too. So I stand in support of Ed Schrock's amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Senator Lindsay and members of the body, I was going to try to answer Senator Bohlke's question about how many bridges across the Missouri River, but there is one from...Senator Schrock, there is one from...I don't know how many counties there are, but every county has a bridge with the exception of Thurston County, from South Sioux City down to Rulo. So every county has a bridge with the exception of one county, Thurston County. I'm trying to get another bridge built. Senator Wehrbein and I have a disagreement where the bridge is going to go, so that's...I'm kind of up on bridges across the Missouri River.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Schrock would you like to close on your amendment?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, what we need to remember is Nebraska is a net exporter of grain, and grain does not flow from Kansas to Nebraska normally. But if you have a small country elevator on the border and they are
