But I do believe that this is a better standard, that we inadvertently lowered the standard when we moved to electing the governor every four years by precluding 50 percent of the time, at least, being able to base it on the last presidential election. And then in case that in the future that if the two-tier system were declared unconstitutional, at least we would have accomplished this by changing that wording from the last gubernatorial to the last presidential election. And so, philosophically, I think it is right. As a word of caution, in case the two-tier system is declared unconstitutional, I also think it does...makes the bill in better shape, and so therefore I ask for for your support. Thank you.
