SPEAKER WITHEM: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to go under call.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Members return to their desk, please. We have had a request for a roll call vote on the Wesely amendment. Members please return to your desks. Unauthorized individuals please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senators Warner and Bohlke, could you check in, please. Senator Schimek, could you check in. Senator Cudaback, Senator Witek, Senator Jensen, Senator McKenzie, Senator Stuhr. Senator McKenzie and Senator Witek. Senator Engel. Senator Engel, Senator McKenzie and Senator Witek. Senator Wesely's amendment. He has authorized us to proceed. Senator Chambers, you're the one that requested a roll call vote. Is that satisfactory with you? We have Senator Witek.
