SPEAKER WITHEM: About a minute, forty seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this is a serious amendment despite what people have said. In fact, it is one of the most precise and easily understood amendments that has been offered because it attempts to restore the Constitution to what it was before all of the confusion occurred. One reason I wanted a few minutes or a few seconds of Senator Hall's time was because I think it is so serious that if we don't have at least 45 people here when the vote is taken, I'm going to be not voting and then I'm going to ask for a reconsideration.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The house is under call. Mr. Clerk, who are we waiting for? We are waiting the arrival of Senator Landis. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Has Senator Landis been located?

SPEAKER WITHEM: Mr. Clerk. He has not been located as of this time.

SENATOR HALL: Let's go ahead and take the roll.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You said take the roll? Is that, you're requesting a roll call vote or a machine vote? A roll call vote has been requested. Mr. Clerk, call the roll. the reverse order has been requested. Please call the roll call in reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken.) 14 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is not adopted. Senator Pedersen, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR PEDERSEN: Point of personal privilege.

SPEAKER WITHEM: State your point.
