

SPEAKER WITHEM: I would like to do that, yes.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: We've asked for unanimous consent to substitute an amendment. Do I hear any objections? Seeing none, so ordered.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Mr. President and members of the body, I'm offering AM1315. What you have on your desk is a penciled up copy of this amendment that there will be a clean copy coming down from bill drafter's office but what is on the desk at this moment, what is being considered is the amendment as it exists on your desk. This is improved language, hopefully, improved language from what I had filed previous to this. Let me explain my rationale for it, my concern about the bill and what the bill might do and why I'm offering this amendment. My goal with this amendment really does...I don't think it deals with the heart of what I understand to be the objectives of the sponsors of the bill. What it tries to do is lop off a lot of unintended consequences. I think yesterday we started this discussion a little bit and the impression I received from supporters of this bill was that their real concern was regulations passed by agencies of state government that would have an impact on the value of real property. That's not what the bill says at this point but that appeared to be the concern. When I was asking questions yesterday though about the way the Jones-Wickersham amendment is currently drafted, it amends the entire rule making process. So it would require any agency of state government, including...Senator Chambers, would you respond to a question?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Does the Board of Barber Examiners have rule-making authority?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I believe they do.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Okay, so it would include, the way it's drafted right now, the Board of Barber Examiners would have to make an analysis of any rules as to whether they constituted a taking. That was the only question I had for you, Senator Chambers. But that's what the impact of this bill would be right now.
