

SENATOR BEUTLER: And the one little bill drafter thing I didn't strike, but that's not important.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I agree with that because if you leave this language in that Senator Beutler is striking, I'd like you to read what is there right now. In line 3 they put the word "or" which creates an alternative. You can do one thing or the other. If you don't strike what Senator Beutler wants stricken, this is what would be required, the estimated but not necessarily quantified fiscal impact on the state. That's what they could do and end it. But if they choose not to do that, this is what follows the "or", or an explanation of where the description of the type of property and fiscal impact may be inspected and obtained. So you're giving this agency the authority to not provide an explanation of where the description of the type of property and fiscal impact may be inspected and obtained. That really doesn't make sense. It might make sense...no, it still wouldn't. But if you change the "or" to "and", but nevertheless, Senator Beutler would take away that problem. As he pointed out in the existing language, this part that he is striking is already taken care of. So if you eliminate that language, I'm almost afraid to read what would remain because of the way it's drafted, but what we're talking about is what would have to be a part of the rule making process. We would have the analysis of any potential takings, we would have a description of the type of property which may be taken, and I think we'd want to strike all of that. Senator Beutler, I think we'd want to strike...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I'll read to you what's left, if you like.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Omitting for the moment the Withem amendment, it would read, an analysis of any potential taking of property under the proposed rule or regulation, including a description of the type of property which may be taken or an explanation of where the description of the type of property may be inspected and obtained. I've left the type of property in there, and you may have questions about that, too. But I just wanted to set forth for the body the duplicative...the clearly duplicative language...
