

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator, I was trying to follow along and see what he was attempting to do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Can I mention it to you, to get your reaction?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you turn to page 2,...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...starting in line 1, I meant line 2,...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...after the word...well what we were striking is in this small subsection (ii) "the estimated but not necessarily quantified fiscal impact on the state". Let me yield time to Senator Beutler, so he can give it to you exactly as it is, 'cause he's right here.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Wickersham, do you want a reading of it as it would read with the amendment?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I think that would be helpful.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, starting with subsection (d) in line 23, okay, and ignoring momentarily the Withem amendment,...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...it would read, "an analysis of any potential taking of property under the proposed rule or regulation, including a description of the type of property which may be taken or an explanation of where the description of the type of property may be inspected and obtained".

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: All right, okay, I think I understand what the amendment does. Thank you.
