SENATOR JONES: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This that we're talking about would have no impact on the private citizen, do you agree with that?

SENATOR JONES: The way that turned out, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it cannot control what the federal government does, isn't that right?

SENATOR JONES: That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you want us to pass a law that cannot touch any of the parties that were involved in the dispute that caused you to bring it here, isn't that true.

SENATOR JONES: That's right, I just want it to state in statutes that we maybe can stop something like that between agents in this state and private people.
