

You're recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Withem, members of the Legislature, I'm not going to pursue any further amendments on this bill at this stage of debate and perhaps never. I guess that's assuming that this amendment gets adopted, because I really do think that this amendment represents some duplicative language that is confusing at best, maybe more troublesome at worst. Again, I remind you all it does is drop the duplicative language in lines 2 and 3 of page 2 of the amendment, which is the estimated but not necessarily quantified fiscal impact on the state, which is already up above where it states a description but not necessarily a quantification of the fiscal impact on state agencies. So it's just some duplicative language. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the closing. The question is adoption of the Beutler amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Call of the house.
