She didn't ask what is the correct spelling of analysis. But, Senator Crosby, the reason I don't have to be too careful about my spelling, if people are not careful about the Constitution, then I know they're not too concerned about how I spell analysis. But now to get back to the issue at hand, Senator Preister did touch on some of the very serious aspects of a bill such as this and these proposals. They do seem, on their surface, to be very inconsequential and innocuous. But in order to discharge a responsibility, an agency has certain preliminary things that it must do. In order to conduct an analysis, it must have something to analyze. That means information is going to have to be gathered, information will have to be studied and when you
