

Property has not, by any term in the Constitution or provision, been elevated above all other rights. In fact, property was mentioned behind other rights. So I am going to do all that I can to make sure that any law that the Legislature enacts will not elevate property above other rights. When these agencies are required to undertake this analysis, they will have to look at what impact their rule or regulation will have on any of these other rights, and they should be required to make a certification that they have, in fact, considered all of these rights and the impact that any rule or regulation, any amendment thereto, would have on these rights. I have at least one other amendment up there. Senator Lindsay has a couple of amendments, and I believe I will be authorized to handle them for him should he not make it here in time. But what this amendment that is before you today would do is say that in the same way that when property...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...must be considered whenever any rule or regulation is being produced, that same consideration must be given to every other right ensured by the Constitution to determine what impact the rule or regulation would have. That's what the amendment would do. And, Madam President, since we are still under call, I would ask simply that we check in.
