PRESIDENT ROBAK: There has been an objection. Senator Jones, to speak to his motion.

SENATOR JONES: Madam President, members of the body, I'd like to do this because I think there is going to be some working out with another senator to try to work something out on this, and then by that time we will have the fiscal impact down here so we know where we are at on it. That's the reason I want to do it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Wehrbein, do you wish to speak to the motion to bracket?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Madam Speaker. I was not going to speak but I was going to talk to Senator Chambers' amendment, but I will speak on this. I would support Senator Jones in his attempt to bracket at this point. I do think there are some issues that should be discussed, and one of the things I was going to take the opportunity to speak on Senator Chambers' amendment was to discuss the fiscal impact. Even though I have been supportive of this bill, I am very conscious of the potential fiscal impact that could be, especially as it has been amended, and I was going to make some of my support conditional on the fiscal impact study that Senator Jones has asked for. So, therefore, in order to have that available, I will support the bracket for that reason because I believe it is something that ought to be looked at. I, frankly, would look at a legislative resolution as an attempt to resolve this, if necessary, after hearing some of the comments and the debate. I do think that this is a reasonable way to get at perhaps an understanding and a potential consensus, and I would support Senator Jones' bracket.
