CLERK: Mr. President, if I may right before that, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined engrossed LB 68, LB 377 and LB 461 and find those bills correctly engrossed. (See pages 1431-33 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, General Affairs Committee offers LB 344. Signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 11 of this year, referred to the General Affairs Committee, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL PRESIDING

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Schellpeper. Good morning.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Mr. Chairman and members, LB 344 is the annual clean-up bill. It has a lot of different technical things in from the charitable gaming part of the Revenue Department. And, basically, what it is, it concerns related receipts. There was some concern that some of the organizations thought that they were attempting to get into their operations a little more and so the committee amendments just concern related receipts. It's just something that everybody thought should be in there to help spell out a little clearly what is actually meant by related receipts. So I would move for the committee amendment.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. You've heard the opening on the committee amendments. Is there any discussion? Seeing none, the question...Senator Schellpeper waives closing. The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 344. Have you all voted?
