

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Pedersen. Any other discussion of the Janssen amendment? Seeing none, Senator Janssen to close on the amendment. Closing is waived. The question is the adoption of the Janssen amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Janssen's amendment.

SENATOR HALL: The Janssen amendment is adopted to the committee amendments. Any other amendments pending?

CLERK: Nothing further.

SENATOR HALL: Seeing none, is there any discussion on the advancement of the committee amendments? If not, Senator Schellpeper waives the closing. The question is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 874. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 874. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR HALL: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Withem, to open on the bill.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yeah, once again, Mr..by the way, what do we have, about five minutes left for consideration of this bill?

SENATOR HALL: Yes.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yeah, this bill was introduced to deal with the situation of vincage wines that are not available...no longer available from the primary American source. This gives a shipping license into the state for those individuals doing business in that area. It was originally a fairly contentious bill among people in the industry because they did not wish to put an exception to the primary American source so we found this other way of dealing with the problem which has definitely quieted the opposition to the underlying LB 874. So that is what...the reason the bill was introduced. I would urge you to advance it.
