expense necessary, incurred as a direct result of their duties and responsibility as a member engaged upon the business of the district. This language will require initial payment of the expenses by the board members before reimbursement could be sought. No prepayment of the board of anticipated expense will require approval of the expenses reimbursed by the full board based upon the criteria set out, that the expenses are necessary, that there's direct result of duties and responsibilities of the board members that are incurred while the members are engaged with the business of the district. This is permissive legislation. The fire districts don't have to do it, but I think it was time that we update this particular section of law and I'll try to answer any question there is related to it.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Hartnett, there are no lights on. Would that constitute your opening and closing? The question is, shall LB 756 be advanced? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: LB 187 introduced by Senator Bohlke. (Read title.) The bill was introduced in January of this year, referred to the Education Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Mr. President, members, you need to listen real carefully about this. It reflects a change in the federal terminology. The feds changed the terminology, therefore, we change our terminology.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Any discussion on the bill? If not, we would vote to advance the bill to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
