Senator Wehrbein is absolutely correct when he indicates that this is not the first resolution or effort by somebody to get the Legislature and the state to do something or take a formal position with reference to Taiwan. I remember when I was in elementary school, and we were studying geography. To show how little respect they had when they were teaching white history, and some people want to go back to it, they just had on the map a big land area that they referred to on the map as Indo-China. That's what it was called, undifferentiated, but China was not the only country in that area. It just meant that it has no meaning, no significance, based on the attitude that the white people who control education in America wants the children in America to know. This particular resolution is based strictly on economic considerations. I'd like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question. Senator Wehrbein, are you aware of any wheat deals or other grain deals that have been consummated between the United States and mainland China?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes. Did you say wheat deals?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, we trade with mainland China. There is a lot of EEP money going into that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Which country do you think makes the largest purchases from the United States, Taiwan or mainland China.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: You know, I really don't know. Off the top of your head, it would be easy to say mainland China because it is bigger, but I don't know that for sure. I really don't have those figures in my mind.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So here could be another issue which might be pertinent to our discussion but no information is had by some of the people who support this resolution. Let me ask you this question. If a choice had to be made between dealing with mainland China and Taiwan on the basis of trade, which one do
