

of the time of registration of the vehicle in the State of Nebraska. And as all of us would...if we'd just stopped and thought just a little bit, there are number of reasons why a person would register their vehicle but perhaps not renew their insurance if they, like a lot of folks do, went south for an extended period of time in the wintertime, had a vehicle that they only used in the summertime, lots of reasons not to pay insurance on a vehicle while it is in storage and not being used on the road in the State of Nebraska. So I apologize to you for not having the bill drafted in the form that it ought to be and that's what this amendment does. It simply strikes for the entire period, which means the entire period of registration which is our annual, generally speaking, an annual registration and inserts "at the time of registration", you have to have insurance, "and while the motor vehicle is operated on a public highway of this state." And I think it would result in a situation that was much less confusing for people, more in keeping with many vehicle owners standard operating practices at this time, so I would encourage the adoption of this amendment. Thank you, Madam President.
