SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You're not talking about a refund at all on the sales tax.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does that amount to a substantial amount? Are we talking about individuals or are you talking about people who lease fleets of cars?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: It could be either I suppose.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why is this amendment offered? Is it worthwhile?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, it has affected several people that lease cars especially the part where they have to pay the full value of this car when it has like 10 or 15,000 miles on it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm going to ask for a division of the question. And what I'd like to do because we don't have the amendment before us, is to take the part of the amendment that would be covered by paragraph 1 because that is entirely distinct from what is in paragraph 2.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's right, it is, you're right. Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President...
