consumer is the one that's going to get the break by being able to buy this luxury car or any car at a reduced price.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But the...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Therefore, the sales tax will be less at a reduced price.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time, Senator. Senator Chambers, thank you. Senator Elmer, your light is next. Excuse me, Senator, there's an amendment to the bill...to the amendment.

CLERK: Senator Coordsen would move to amend the Schellpeper amendment, Madam President. (F110 appears on page 1471 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: We are amending Sections 13, 17 and 19. Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Madam President. This is in Section 13. If you happen to have a copy of the amendment, AM1390, it's on page 4, line 8. Senator Chambers asked a question about the language and I believe there was an error in drafting this section reflective of determining the value of a vehicle for the purposes of assessment of local property taxes, in the amended version, reads, which have been previously...motor vehicles which have been previously licensed and registered or have over 10,000 miles on the odometer at the time of sale. My amendment strikes the "or have" and replaces that with the language "and has". So the section would read, motor vehicles which have previously...been previously licensed and registered and have over 10,000 miles on the odometer at the time of sale. It's my understanding, from the discussion, that this is what Senator Schellpeper intended. I might make one comment, we've gotten off the topic in talking about sales tax, this section of the bill reflects to the valuation of a vehicle for local property tax purposes. It has absolutely nothing to do with sales tax whatsoever. That is a function you pay sales tax on the difference, either the outright purchase price or the difference between the trade-in and...that you pay for the new vehicle. So you pay sales tax on the actual dollars exchanged. It has no impact on this section of statute whatsoever. I would encourage the adoption of this amendment. I think there is some
