

took it back to the dealer and it was a...he would not buy that back from me for 15 percent, it was more than 20 percent that they took off of the...of the price that they would give me for that car. So now think about that. If we set that, is that going to open the door that a dealer is not going to be able to charge you or discount you more than 15 percent? I don't know, maybe we're opening the door on this. But I think...I think it should be open, not...not less than 15 percent. You should be able to go above that. The amendment hasn't been filed yet but i'm perceiving that I'm not going to...I'm not going to be supporting his amendment. I do support Senator Schellpeper's amendment that's before us right now. Senator Schellpeper, would you like to elaborate on that a little bit? Would that happen?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, I...Senator, I agree with you. It seems like we're trying to help the consumer here and we're getting off on the wrong track. We're not trying to help the car dealer, we're trying to help the consumer buy vehicles, and if they can go and buy them and pay a lower tax on them, that's the object of this amendment. So I think we're off on the wrong...wrong section there.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Schellpeper, do you think...how much is going...revenue is going to be lost here? I just...I just don't think there are that many of these vehicles that are purchased that it's going to be a big deflect on the revenue of the county.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I really don't know, Senator, how many vehicles are sold each year. I know there's getting to be a lot more of them leased each year so maybe there would become more and more each year, but I have no idea how many are out there.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Do you know how much, say, on a 30,000 dollar vehicle, how much this would amount to on the tax on it? Of course, it all depends upon where you live too.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Depends upon what district you're in.

SENATOR JANSSEN: What do you suppose it would be, 10 percent less?
