

the government power of eminent domain. It is necessary, for the purposes of Senator Fisher's bill, that they be able to include in this process property that had previously been acquired through the power of eminent domain because the ammunition depot was acquired by a variety of mechanisms, not excluding this power. My thought in this amendment was that it's prospective in nature that future groups created under the Nebraska Industrial Development Corporation Act would not be able to acquire private property for the purposes of the act by the power of eminent domain. With that, I would ask for the adoption of the amendment. It doesn't change anything else in the bill other than that small change. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Is there any discussion of the Coordsen amendment? Seeing none, Senator Coordsen waives closing. The question before you is the adoption of the Coordsen amendment to LB 494. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.
