SPEAKER WITHEM: On the Bernard-Stevens amendment, Senator Engel.

SENATOR ENGEL: I discussed this with Senator Bernard-Stevens and that was really the intent, that everybody would get a copy, so there is absolutely no problem with that, and I totally support his amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wesely, on the Bernard-Stevens amendment. Senator Robinson, on the Bernard-Stevens amendment. Senator Bernard-Stevens, to close on the Bernard-Stevens amendment. Closing is waived. The question is the adoption of the Bernard-Stevens amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.
