

Chambers, do you wish to speak to the Wickersham amendment to the Engel amendment to LB 425?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Madam President, thank you. And I'd like to speak to Reve...I meant Senator Wickersham also. Senator Bob, may I ask you a question or two about your amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Certainly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And bear with me because I just got a copy.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes, I understand that, Senator, and I wish we had more time myself.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, would you look in line 7, would you be adverse, in line 7, and line 19, after "policies" insert the two words "and procedures", and I will tell you why. You may...I think maybe what was envisioned in the original language, in terms of processes, would be the idea of procedures which would be established governing the steps or stages through which certain things must pass to be accomplished. I don't think if we added "and procedures" would take anything away from what you're trying to do.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No, Senator, I agree and...but given the posture the bill is in now, this is already an amendment to an amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I know.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well I would do that later. But I just want to be sure that it's not something that...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you. No, personally, I would have no objection, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, it won't disrupt what you're doing.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.
