

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: All right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: With regard to other aspects of your amendment, there still is retained in the Engel amendment as I read it, a definition of qualified business and your usages in this particular amendment don't talk about qualified businesses and I'm wondering, I kind of like the concept of a qualified business as in the Engel amendment and I'm wondering whether or not this amendment shouldn't be, your amendment shouldn't be tied back into that definition. Did you have any intent on that one way or the other?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No, except I think this restricts...if you're talking about qualified in a generic sense, fewer businesses are...

SENATOR BEUTLER: I'm talking about qualified as defined in the Engel amendment on page 3 at the very bottom is where it starts. It goes on into the entire page 4. I mean either we should get rid of that definition or...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The only portion of that in a kind of a general sense that the amendment addresses is the size of a qualified business.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, so as to...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...as to the type of business it's your intent that...(interruption)

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That is not changed.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...you talked...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, so the term qualified business is intended to apply to these businesses...(inaudible)
