

says every member gets a copy of the report, and the reason I say that if it is, that was an amendment I offered earlier this afternoon that the Legislature already adopted.

SENATOR HALL: Oh, well then, I apologize, I did not know that and if that's the case, there's not need for this to be adopted. It can go away. What this does, David, is it says on page 3, line 2, and if you've got the bill in front of you, all it says is that after "report" it would strike "by making a request to" so those five words would be stricken and it would insert "from" so that in other words the department would just send us those reports. And if it has been adopted there is no need to duplicate that.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Well, Tim, what we adopted, just to make sure it does the same thing what you wanted is again, on page 3, I'm on line 2, and what the amendment was I offered that again we adopted was after the word "report"...

SENATOR HALL: Right.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ...each member of the Legislature shall receive a copy of such report, it was inserted a period and the rest of that sentence was stricken.

SENATOR HALL: That works.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Okay, and that's what we've already agreed upon.

SENATOR HALL: We virtually did the same thing, so, Madam President, Mr. Clerk, I would respectfully ask that the amendment be withdrawn.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, any other amendments to the Engel amendment?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Beutler would move to amend the Engel amendment. (FA119 appears on page 1506 of the Legislative Journal.)
