CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Members of the Legislature, this is just a technical cleanup amendment. It strikes the sentence that says that it is in the intent of the Legislature that \$3 million be appropriated, et cetera, et cetera, and the only reason I'm doing that is because this has an A bill and the money portion of this will be dealt with in the A bill, so I'm just getting rid of duplicative language. It's not intended to do anything substantive to the bill, Senator Engel. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Is there any discussion of the Beutler amendment? Seeing none, Senator Beutler, do you wish to close? Senator Beutler, do you wish to close?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, again, the sentence that is being stricken begins on line 11, page 2 and it's just that one sentence. It does not strike the sentence that begins on line 15 and goes to line 17, page 2. That remains, just the intent sentence. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. The question before you is the adoption of the Beutler amendment to the Engel amendment to LB 425. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment to Senator Engel's amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Beutler amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Hall would move to amend. (JA120 appears on page 1506 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Hall.
